The sales tax brought in 1.6 million in revenues and 54 less parcels were turned in for tax deeds. The Towns bridge aid is sitting with the county for approval. 5 engineering outfits to present proposals for eliminating crossing "A" in Wascott, all will become highway E. County board on the 15th*to send WI transportation a proposal to turn highway H into a state highway. CWD meets before the board meeting. Large recycling items now being accepted at the Highway E site for a small fee. Listing to be available through the County board. Also all building permits are increasing, schedules to be posted on the County website.

- 10. <u>Fire department</u>: Mark presented for Nova-The fire department needs and updated fax machine. Jon said to get a hold of him and he will assist them. Garage doors failing, will need to have Brule Door come out and look at them, only seems to affect one door.
- 11. Town Employees/Roads: Mark-brushing-completed 2 passes on the Town roads. Have graveled a lot of roads, but not all are completed. Mark contacted Northland Lawn and Sport on the status of the brusher, he needs to go look at it when he has time. Mason tendered his resignation before the meeting. There are 3 telephones that need to be replaced, Dahlberg has replaced all 3, they used older poles so we may only need to pay parts and labor, 3 phone pedestals were damaged, 2 culverts and 1 stop sign. We can add a piece to one culvert and still have to meet with the resident on the other. The cruise went on the grader; Mark got the parts and fixed it. Mark says pickup truck should be good for a few years; a grader might be a better option. State supposedly set aside more money for local roads, will wait to see how that transpires. Germano's have been hauling straight to Camp road, still being worked on. Still 3 culverts to replace.

12. Building permits and zoning issues:

- 1) DeVries-(Brosz) Road-only 20 feet of access, our requirements are 30 feet-the board will have to look at before approving.
- 2) OBH-Board of adjustment kicked it back, may come back up on the agenda at a later date.
- 3) Wentworth road (Ronald Boben)-a garage is already there, wants to put a house next to it, already approved by County. Jon voted to approve, Mary seconded, carried 7:01 pm

The County is trying to make all their roads open to 4 wheelers.
